Mission Adopt-A-Block would like to thank all the volunteers who came out this spring to be apart of their First Annual Spring Community Litter Clean-Up. Approximately 160 volunteers from 8 local non-profit organizations participated in picking up litter in some of Mission's heavily littered hotspots. The event took place over four Saturdays in April & May and the litter collected off Mission's streets and green

## Feature Story- Adopt-A-Block Acknowledges MACL Dedicated Litter Control Volunteers

While the Mission Association for Community Living (MACL) celebrates its 50 years, Mission Adopt-A-Block celebrates MACL and all of their hard-working dedicated volunteers that participated weekly and consistently in Adopt-A-Block's anti-litter program. Approximately 10 volunteers rotate regularly maintaining weekly routes that include; Main St. 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave., Terry Ave., Dewdney Trunk and the area around Safeway. Dan O'Neill is just one of the many MACL individuals who participates in Adopt-A-Block's program, through Bridge Training Services. O'Neill comments, "people often say thank-you and good job while we are out

picking up litter". The MACL team agrees that volunteering in litter control gives them a sense of pride, not only because they are making Mission a cleaner city, but because its an activity they do regularly and they take pride in the streets they maintain. O'Neill adds, "We separate the recyclables we pick up and the funds we collect from them go towards our coffee fund for Tim Horton's", another reason for O'Neill's enjoyment in being part of AAB's program.

Adopt-A-Block was pleasantly surprised with MACL's offer to replace the organization's stolen computer, and welcomed the gift of a laptop, a new computer

## **Adopt-A-Block Supports Communities in Bloom**



Communities in Bloom (CNB) is a Canada-wide non-profit organization with international affiliations dedicated to recognizing community projects that involved heritage, environmental awareness and beautification. With the support of the District of Mission, a local volunteer committee was formed in 2004 to undertake Mission's annual participation in CNB. Several community groups work together in the spirit of friendly cooperation to achieve commu-

nity wide beautification goals. Last year, 2007, Mission scored 91.2% and was awarded the 2007 Communities in Bloom Provincial Trophy for "Community Involvement". Mission also received special recognition for "Environmental Awareness", four out of five blooms and increased their over all score from previous years. CNB encourages local residents to enter their residential gardens (flower & vegetable) in the garden competition, as well as businesses to compete in the

business categories. Adopt-A-Block encourages volunteers, friends and supporters to contribute to CNB's goal of going for 5 blooms this year, by taking a stroll with a goal and picking up the litter in your neighborhood, or while visiting parklands, as well as cleaning business store fronts. It takes a team effort to make Mission, not only a cleaner & safer place, but a beautiful city to live in and be proud of. Thank-you. You are making a difference!
